Safety

1. Working with integrity to protect our people, contractors, and suppliers from any harm related to our activities, by complying with all applicable regulations and other requirements subscribed to in the countries where we operate.

Health and well-being

2. Providing and maintaining safe and healthy work environments and places for our employees and contractors through the prevention of occupational illnesses and injuries, with the aim of eliminating hazards and reducing health and safety risks.

Gender equality

3. Implementing actions in the area of workplace equality, inclusion, and non-discrimination to promote the integral development of all employees, regardless of gender.

Continuous improvement

4. Continuously improving our safety and health management systems to achieve our objectives and programs, including the goal of zero accidents.

Risk management

5. Involving our workers and their representatives, as well as our contractors, in the design and implementation of occupational safety controls, identifying, minimizing, and eliminating safety and health risks through objective and systematic assessments.

6. Developing the skills and competencies of our personnel in the field of occupational safety and health.

7. Promote, in collaboration with the communities where we operate, a healthy lifestyle.

Compliance with international standards

8. Comply with the international standards, voluntary programs, and collective agreements related to safety and health to which the company subscribes.

9. Establish priorities and manage action plans to meet the requirements and needs in safety and health matters.

Quantitative goals

10. Set quantitative goals to ensure continuous improvement in occupational safety and health performance.
